PROBLEMS TO SOLVE

Problems to Solve

- 1. Improve **safety** for drivers and pedestrians
- 2. Improve access to West Willow
- 3. **Beautify** the US-12 corridor

Safety

- Safety is the #1 concern
- What we have heard:
 - Slow down speeds off I-94
 - Help drivers understand they are driving near a neighborhood
 - Make it safer for pedestrians to get from West Willow to intersection of M-17 and Ford Blvd
 - Improve safety on US-12 east of Wiard Rd

Access to West Willow

- What we have heard:
 - Provide better access for West Willow residents
 - Discourage cut-through traffic in West Willow
 - Reduce traffic congestion on Dorset Ave
 - Help pedestrians get across US-12 safely


Beautification

- What we have heard:
 - US-12 should be a welcoming gateway to the community and the American Center for Mobility

The Plan

- Includes:
 - Street lighting from I-94 to county line
 - Landscaping, beautification and improved signage
 - Different access to West Willow

The Plan

- Includes (cont.):
 - Create a narrower boulevard off I-94
 - Simplify the intersection of M-17 and US-12
 - Remove bridge
 - Improve pedestrian crossing from West Willow to the intersection of M-17 and Ford Blvd

Street Lighting

- Lights on US-12 from the I-94 ramps to the county line
- To be designed and constructed by DTE





Beautification

 Gateway signs for neighborhood and for the American Center for Mobility

 Landscaping along the corridor will be designed in early 2020 with stakeholder input

Landscaping and Sign Examples







Access to West Willow

- Adds access from eastbound US-12 to Service Dr
- Removes access from US-12 to Gates Ave
- Includes right-turn lanes from US-12 into West Willow
- Utilizes "Michigan left" to discourage cut-through traffic in the neighborhoods

Bridge

- Remove bridge and ramp
- Will eliminate the free flow movement onto eastbound US-12



M-17 and US-12 Intersection

- Smooth out curve
- Intersection will T directly into US-12
- Eliminates direct access from M-17 to Dorset Ave



Boulevard

- Narrows median to ~70 ft near the intersection of US-12 and M-17
 - Similar to the width of parts of US-12 in Canton

 Curve is designed to slow down traffic from I-94 (speed limit will still be 55 mph)

Boulevard Example



Pedestrian Safety

- Crossing at intersection of M-17 and US-12
- Traffic signals
- Pedestrians enter/exit West Willow at Fox Ave







THE PROCESS SO FAR

Background

- \$8 million from MDOT's budget
- Must be spent on MDOT roads in this area
- WCRC is helping Ypsilanti Township and MDOT to administer the project
- Project will be permitted by MDOT
- Construction in 2020/2021

- Stakeholder
 Brainstorming
 Session: Oct. 4
 - Approx. 25attendees
 - Small group breakouts



- Public Meeting #1: Oct. 29
 - Approx. 50 attendees
 - Reviewed 3 options for corridor
 - Received verbal and written feedback



- Online Comments: Oct. 30 Nov. 7
 - Approx. 80 submissions
- WCRC Social Media Posting
 - Reached approx. 7,000 people

Themes

- Either loved or absolutely hated roundabouts
- Pedestrian safety is a major concern
- Mixed thoughts on the speed of traffic

Decision Making

- So how did we choose the plan?
 - + Analyzed traffic models
 - + Generated cost estimates
 - + Reviewed community input and evaluation factors

NEXT STEPS

Schedule

- Now late Spring 2020
 - Design phase
 - Roadway and drainage design
 - Street lighting design
 - Landscaping design with stakeholder input
 - Utility coordination

Schedule¹

- Summer 2020
 - Project posted for bidding (approx. 30 days)
 - Contractor selected
 - Contractor bid amount at this time will determine final project scope
 - Public Meeting #3 (Goal: June 2020)

Schedule

- Mid Summer 2020
 - Construction to begin

- Spring/Summer 2021
 - Project to be completed
