#### 2020-2021 Winter Maintenance Guidelines

Commissioner Barb Fuller expressed concerns of people parking cars on the roads in subdivisions which become obstacles to the Road Commission snowplows. Commissioner Fuller would like to see a provision where communities direct residents to remove their parked cars off the roads during a snow event. Commissioner Doug Fuller agreed with Commissioner Barb Fuller's comments.

Sheryl Siddall, Managing Director, stated that the Road Commission does not have the authority to pass ordinances for winter maintenance activities. We can work with townships on passing and enforcing any township ordinances on removing parked vehicles during winter snow events. Sheryl stated there is a problem with subdivisions that have smaller lots and multiple vehicles per household egarding where they can park their vehicles. We can also work with townships on contact a ting residents about snow removal on subdivision roads.

Jim Harmon, Director of Operations, stated that it is required to have a local unit of government pass any parking ordinances. This has been brought to the attention of the townships in the past but there has not been an action from the townships to enforce no parking during a snow event. Jim start the hand Commission works closely with Washtenaw County Emergency Manager, ant.

Commissioner Rod Green aske in the re way anything that can be done regarding senior citizens not physically able to clear the snow from their driveway entrance. - Dan reported on the webinar he attended on strategies for funding pension and OPEB obligations and one of the main speakers was MERS.



Dear Sirs:

My wife and I have lived at 2692 Byington Blvd., Ann Arbor MI 48105 for 53 years. In the last several months there has been some road rebuilding on Riverbend Dr, (near Lot 15, Riverbend Subdivision), north and uphill from our house. This has resulted in a major change in water flow through our area. We now have had a small creek run through our property 3 times, following moderate rains (1 to 3 inches). The new water course runs from the northeast corner toward the southwest of our lot (number 26 in Riverdale Subdivision). Fortunately, it dries out fairly quickly because we have sandy soil.

This new water course has caused us problems with drainage into my basement woodworking shop, which has a door on the lower level of the west side of our house. We have had to redo 3 of our down spouts from our eaves and make a small berm in order to turn the creek. In short, this new creek ran right into my shop.

In our 53 years living here, we have never seen water running in this small vale of ours, even back in the flood (about 1968) with a "100-year" rain (9 inches in one day).

We looked at the new water route after a heavy rain yesterday. Apparently the road construction near Miles' home (Lot 15, Riverbend) has diverted the water down the Miles' driveway (instead of staying near Riverbend Dr.). It may be that a culvert is needed to keep the water from turning down Miles' driveway, and to keep it on the roadbed, as it has been for at least 53 years.

We would desire the Road Commission look at this change in the watershed and propose a fix of the problem.

Road grade causing dirt and gravel accumulation on driveway after each heavy rain

In June, I sent a letter to the Road Commission explaining that for several years dirt, stones and leaves have been accumulating on our driveway after each rain because the gravel roadbed has become higher that our driveway entrance. A grader spread a load of stones on the road, but the problem remains.

The house across the road is about 40 feet higher than our driveway. The rain run-off from that steep driveway rushes across the road in a torrent and washes the road gravel down our driveway.

August 23, 2020: Measured driveway-to-roadbed distance at all six driveways on the north side of Craig Road.

When our concrete driveway was paved in 2008, the two entrances were higher than the roadbed. Over the years periodic roadbed grading elevated the road in front our home.

Our driveway is now the highest point on Craig Road. Ten feet east of our driveway is a 200-foot long dip in the road with empty wooded lots to the north and south of the road. Could the road be graded 7 or 8 inches lower than our driveway to drain into one of these empty lots instead of into our lawn and driveway?

Road grade has caused dirt and gravel accumulation on our driveway after each heavy rain.

The water runoff from the driveway across the street flows down-hill across the road, down our driveway and lawn, across our backyard where it pools near our garden, then it continues down hill into our neighbor's backyard yard on Robinwood.

Ten years ago the lip of our eastern driveway entrance was above the surface of the gravel road. Today, the roadbed is several inches higher than our driveway. This is causing water, dirt and gravel to wash down our driveway after every heavy rain. We must shovel dirt and debris that accumulates at the bottom of our driveway after each rain. The grading at the western driveway entrance is fine.

There is an unoccupied wooded lot next to our eastern property line. If the lowest point could be moved 50 feet east, the road would drain into the wooded lot.

We have lived at this address for 37 years. This problem began getting worse several years ago. Twelve years ago the other end of our circular driveway had this same problem but the Road Commission graded the road to drain to the south to solve the problem. Can the gravel roadbed be adjusted to drain away from our eastern entrance driveway to alleviate this problem?

Dear Mr. Caldwell,

On the morning of September 1, I inspected Craig Road and discussed my observations yesterday with our District Foreman upon his return to work. I also reviewed topographical maps to further understand drainage patterns. I agree with your assessment that Craig Road has changed over the years. Erosion, compaction and sedimentation have changed the elevation of this unpaved, local road. The road surface was once higher, which allowed runoff along the north half of the road to discharge intermittently uphill of your eastern driveway. Changes in road elevation east of your frontage are contributing a greater amount of concentrated runoff at your eastern driveway approach, which currently matches the elevation of the road. I agree that this is exacerbated during torrential rainfall and acknowledge that runoff from properties south of Craig Road and higher in elevation will flow directly across the road under those conditions. Heavy runoff causes further erosion carrying sediment to your property, which is significantly lower than the road. I also observed evidence of recent erosion on Craig Road following torrential events west of your property and sedimentation deposited onto Wagner Road.

In order to address your concerns, this segment of Craig Road needs to be substantially improved, which will require local investment and come at considerable cost. We cannot solve these concerns by routine maintenance activities. While state and federal funds provide a majority of the Road Commission revenue, these funds frequently go towards the improvement of primary roads, not local roads. The amount of state funding allocated towards local roads is often only enough to fund winter maintenance, pothole patching and scraping of gravel roads. If the Road Commission wants to make a local road improvement beyond routine maintenance, the project's funding must be matched by a source other than the Road Commission, typically a township.

Local roads make up two-thirds of WCRC's road network (over 1,000 miles), including subdivision roads. Understanding that there is simply not enough funding to improve the County's local roads, the Road Commission has established a Local Road Matching Program. Annually, the Road Commission offers each township matching funds to promote partnership and encourage investment in local roads. Historically, townships have been the Road Commission's biggest partner in improving local roads.

Another tool to fund local road improvements are Special Assessment Districts (S.A.D.). An S.A.D. is a designated area where a majority of property owners agree to allow a government agency to levy a special property tax to improve a public road. If approved, the Road Commission or the local municipality (Scio Township in this case) would front the cost of the road improvement and property owners agree to pay the cost over a period of years.

We will discuss Craig Road with Scio Township to determine if there is interest and support for road and drainage improvements. Please contact me if you have further questions.

#### 1. 2021 Capital Equipment Purchase - International HV613 Truck Chassis

Staff is requesting the Board authorize the purchase of four (4) new 2021 model year International HV613 SBA 6x4 heavy truck cab/chassis from Tri-County International Trucks, Inc. of Jackson, Michigan using the State of Michigan MIDEAL purchasing program (MIDEAL Contract # 071B6600122 Spec #3958 0172D). In accordance with the attached quotation from Tri-County International dated September 01, 2020, for a total cost of \$485,146.36. Component upfitting will be presented for Board approval separately using the City of Rochester Hills MITN Purchasing Cooperative Member Service Agreement. This purchase will replace four trucks to be determined at a later date. The proposed equipment purchase will be funded in the 2021 fiscal year capital equipment budget. Purchase authorization at this time will ensure work-ready delivery prior to next winter. Installment financing remains an option, consistent with the method used for FY20 for heavy truck component upfitting purchasing and would be processed in spring 2021 if required.

PROPOSED MOTION: that upon the recommendation of the Director of Operations and the concurrence of the Managing Director, the Board hereby approves the purchase from Tri-County International Trucks, Inc., 3001 E. High Street, Jackson, Michigan, 49203 through the State of Michigan MIDEAL purchasing program of four (4) new model year 2021 International HV613 SBA 6x4 heavy truck cab/chassis for the total cost of \$485,146.36.

## 2. <u>2021 Capital Equipment Purchase – International HV613 Cab/Chassis</u> Upfitting

Staff is requesting the Board authorize the purchase of component upfitting for four (4) new 2021 model year International HV613 SBA 6x4 heavy truck cab/chassis from Truck & Trailer Specialties, Inc. of 1200 Victory Drive, Howell, Michigan, 48843 using the City of Rochester Hills MITN Purchasing Cooperative Member Service Agreement, RFP-RH-13-030. This service agreement provides that any MITN Purchasing Cooperative Member (WCRC is a member) may purchase equipment upfitting at prices and pricing structure stated in the City of Rochester Hills agreement. In accordance with the attached quotation from Truck & Trailer Specialties dated September 1, 2020, the total cost is \$654,172.00 for all four units. The City of Rochester Hills Agreement provides a 2% discount off (\$13,083.44) the total price taken at invoice if the payment is received within 30 days. This is an additional cost benefit over MIDeal. This purchase authorization is planned for the FY2021 budget for road equipment capital outlay. Installment financing remains an option, consistent with the method used for FY20 for heavy truck component upfitting purchasing and would be processed in spring 2021 if required.

PROPOSED MOTION: that upon the recommendation of the Director of Operations and the concurrence of the Managing Director, the Board hereby approves the purchase from Truck & Trailer Specialties, Inc., 1200 Victory Drive, Howell, Michigan, 48843 through the City of Rochester Hills MITN Purchasing Cooperative Member Service Agreement of component upfitting for four (4) new model year 2021 International HV613 heavy truck cab/chassis for the total cost of \$654,172.00. It is understood that a 2% discount of the total price will be reimbursed to the Road Commission at time of invoice provided payment is received by Truck & Trailer within 30 days.

## 3. <u>2020 Capital Equipment Purchase Authorization – GMC 1500 Double Cab Pickup Trucks</u>

Staff is requesting the Board authorize the purchase of five (5) new 2021 GMC Sierra 1500 4WD Double Cab pickup trucks from Todd Wenzel Buick GMC of Westland using the State of Michigan MIDeal purchasing program (MIDeal Contract # 071B7700184 MiDeal Spec # 0073-4WDL). Please reference attached quotation from Todd Wenzel Buick GMC received August 25, 2020 for a total cost of \$141,924.85 (two trucks for \$28,169.30 each and three trucks with the hitch package for \$28,528.75 each). These trucks will be assigned to the Engineering Department, displacing Trucks #125, #130, #171, #173, and #182, ultimately displacing five aged pickups for auction. Delivery of the new pickup trucks is anticipated prior to year-end. This purchase authorization is included in the FY2020 budget for road equipment capital outlay.

PROPOSED MOTION: that upon the recommendation of the Director of Operations and the concurrence of the Managing Director and Director of Engineering, the Board hereby approves the purchase from Todd Wenzel Buick GMC of Westland of five (5) new 2021 GMC Sierra 1500 4WD Double Cab pickup trucks for the total cost of \$141,924.85 through the State of Michigan MIDeal purchasing program.

#### 4. 2020 Capital Equipment Purchase Authorization - GMC 2500HD Pickup Trucks

Staff is requesting the Board authorize the purchase of two (2) new 2021 GMC Sierra 2500HD 4WD Double Cab pickup trucks from Todd Wenzel Buick GMC of Westland using the State of Michigan MIDeal purchasing program (MIDeal Contract # 071B7700184 MiDeal Spec # 0077-4WDL). Please reference attached quotation from Todd Wenzel Buick GMC received August 25, 2020 for a total cost of \$63,982.30 (one truck for \$31,953.65, the second truck with the optional cloth seat trim for \$32,028.65). These trucks will be assigned to the District #4 and Heavy Equipment foremen, displacing Trucks #114 and #127 for reassignment, ultimately displacing two aged pickup trucks for auction. Delivery of the new pickup trucks is anticipated prior to year-end. The proposed equipment purchase is funded in the 2020 Capital Outlay: Road Equipment budget.

PROPOSED MOTION: that upon the recommendation of the Director of Operations and the concurrence of the Managing Director, the Board hereby approves the purchase from Todd Wenzel Buick GMC of Westland of two (2) new 2021 GMC Sierra 2500HD 4WD Double Cab pickup trucks for the total cost of \$63,982.30 through the State of Michigan MIDeal purchasing program.

#### 5. <u>Huron Waterloo Loop Phase 1B - Construction Engineering Amendment</u>

Staff is requesting the Board authorize the amendment of the Fishbeck purchase order for the construction engineering on the Huron Waterloo Loop Phase 1B project. On February 19, 2019 the Board approved (RC19-036), the original Fishbeck Purchase Order for construction engineering services. Construction on the non-motorized shared use path is nearly finished. The original construction engineering budget was based on a duration of services significantly less than the actual Contractor construction schedule. The costs for the construction engineering services are funded entirely by the Washtenaw County Parks and Recreation Commission. The proposed budget increase of \$90,000 has been discussed with Washtenaw County Parks and Recreation Commission staff.

PROPOSED MOTION: that upon the recommendation of the Director of Engineering/County Highway Engineer and the concurrence of the Managing Director, the Board hereby authorizes the amendment of the Fishbeck purchase order for construction engineering services on the Huron Waterloo Loop Phase 1B project located in Lyndon Township to a total amount not to exceed \$406,600.

#### 6. Trinkle Road Improvement Project - Construction Contract

Staff is requesting the Board accept the low bid and authorize the Managing Director to enter into a contract with C & D Hughes, Inc. to construct the Trinkle Road Improvement Project located in Sections 7 and 8 of Lima Township. The work consists of modifying the road profile with a hill cut, tree removal, widening, ditching and related items. The Board previously approved the 2020 Lima Township Second Agreement on June 16, 2020 (RC20-173) for the project. The project is funded by Lima Township and WCRC local road and drainage matching funds. The Board also previously approved the plans and authorized staff to seek bids on August 18, 2020 (RC20-237). The bids were received on or before September 9, 2020 and C & D Hughes, Inc. was the low bid at \$156,024.80. The bid tabulation has been shared with the Township and is provided as an attachment.

PROPOSED MOTION: that upon the recommendation of the Director of Engineering / County Highway Engineer and the concurrence of the Managing Director, the Board hereby accepts the low bid and authorizes the Managing Director to sign the contract with C & D Hughes, Inc. to complete the Trinkle Road Improvement Project located in Sections 7 and 8 of Lima Township.

#### 7. Approval of Waiver and Plan for Defined Benefit Pension System

Per Public Act 202 of 2017 the Road Commission is required to submit information on its defined benefit pension program with the Municipal Employees' Retirement System of Michigan (MERS). If the funded status of the plan is below 60% then the state's initial determination is that the plan is underfunded. The Road Commission's plan as of the last actuary report (12/31/19) is at 53% funded and the Act requires submittal of an application for waiver as well as an action plan to get to the 60% threshold. The Road Commission has made changes to its defined benefit pension plan as well as extra contributions and is confident that we will be at or above this target within 8 years or less. A requirement of the act is that the governing body approve the Waiver Application and Plan.

PROPOSED MOTION: that upon the recommendation of the Director of Finance and IT and the concurrence of the Managing Director, the Board hereby approves the Protecting Local Government Retirement and Benefits Act Application for Waiver and Plan: Defined Benefit Pension Retirement Systems.

#### 8. Payroll & Bills for September 2, 2020

Staff is requesting the Board to approve the payment of payroll and bills for September 2, 2020.

PROPOSED MOTION: the Board hereby approves Voucher 10418 totaling \$292,447.85 for payroll of September 2, 2020, and Voucher 10419 totaling \$2,042,036.76 in payment of bills for September 2, 2020.

#### **B. ACTION ITEMS**

# 1. <u>Michigan County Road Commission Self-Insurance Pool By-Laws</u> Amendment

The Michigan County Road Commission Self-Insurance Pool (MCRCSIP) is requesting an amendment to its bylaws to allow a county that has assumed the powers, duties and functions of its road commission to apply to become an associate member of MCRCSIP.

PROPOSED MOTION: the Board hereby votes (YES / NO) to amend Article IV, Section 2 of the Michigan County Road Commission Self-Insurance Pool By-Laws to allow a county that has assumed the powers, duties and functions of its road commission under MCL 46.11(s) or MCL 224.6(5) to apply to become an Associate Member of the Pool. Associate Members shall not have voting rights, nor shall they be eligible to serve as Directors on the Pool Board. Associate Members shall be able to be terminated by a 2/3 vote of the Pool Board.

#### 2. WCRC Bylaws

The Board of County Road Commissioners of Washtenaw County (WCRC Board) would like to adopt a set of bylaws to govern the conduct of the WCRC Board and how it conducts its meetings.

#### PROPOSED MOTION:

WHEREAS, the Board of County Road Commissioners of Washtenaw County (the "Board") desires to establish Bylaws to govern the conduct of the Board, and

WHEREAS, the Board has prepared the attached Bylaws.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED that the Board hereby adopts the attached Bylaws of the Board.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that beginning three (3) years from December 2020, the Board shall review its Bylaws every third year at its organizational meeting.

# 3. <u>Proposed Abandonment of Sharon Hollow Road Right-of-Way, north of Grass Lake Road, Sharon Township</u>

Staff received a valid petition to abandon an unimproved portion of Sharon Hollow Road, north of Grass Lake Road, lying in Sections 4 & 5 of Sharon Township, being more particularly described in Attachment A. The subject area of Sharon Hollow Road was established under the 1931 McNitt Act which set forth a process whereby township roads would be taken over by county road commissions. After the takeover, file records dating to 1936 indicate the road was closed by gates and used for farm access only. Certification maps indicate the road is not certified or maintained by the WCRC.

The petitioner cites the following arguments in support of the claim for abandonment. 1) The road has not been open or used by the public in over 84 years. 2) The road should be abandoned as it is overgrown, washed out and of no use to the public, and 3) There is no benefit nor is it economically feasible to bring the road to current county standards. All abutting landowners were contacted by the petitioner and support the proposed abandonment eliminating the need for a public hearing.

#### PROPOSED MOTION:

WHEREAS, this Board has received a petition from seven (7) freeholders of the Township of Sharon, Washtenaw County, Michigan, petitioning for the absolute abandonment and discontinuance of an unimproved portion of Sharon Hollow Road, north of Grass Lake Road, lying in Sections 4 & 5 of Sharon Township, Washtenaw County, Michigan, being more particularly described in Attachment "A"

WHEREAS, after viewing the premises and hearing the reasons of the petitioner, that in the interest of the public, said Public Road Right of Way of the aforementioned Sharon Hollow Road, as described, shall be absolutely abandoned,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Road Commissioners of the County of Washtenaw, that the described Public Road Right of Way of Sharon Hollow Road, north of Grass Lake Road, lying in Sections 4 & 5 of Sharon Township, being under the jurisdiction of the Washtenaw County Road Commission is hereby <u>absolutely abandoned</u> as Public Right of Way, being subject to and reserving therein an easement for existing utilities of record and/or use, as now occupying said right of way.



**Filing:** This Application for Waiver must be approved by the local government's administrative officer and its governing body. **You must provide proof of your governing body approving this Application for Waiver and attach the documentation as a separate PDF document.** Failure to provide documentation that demonstrates approval from your governing body will automatically result in a disapproval of the waiver application.

The completed application must be submitted via email to <u>LocalRetirementReporting@michigan.gov</u>. If you have multiple underfunded retirement systems, you are required to complete separate applications and send a separate email for each underfunded system. Please attach each application as a separate PDF document in addition to all applicable supporting documentation.

The subject line of the email(s) should be in the following format: **Waiver-20XX**, **Local Government Name**, **Retirement System Name** (e.g. Waiver-2018, City of Lansing, Employees' Retirement System Pension Plan). Treasury will send an automatic reply acknowledging receipt of the email. Your individual email settings must allow for receipt of Treasury's automatic reply. This will be the only notification confirming receipt of the application(s).

Considerations for Waiver: A successful Application for Waiver will demonstrate what your local government has already done to adequately address its underfunded status. Prospective solutions will not be granted merit in determining the outcome of the waiver application (e.g. future amendments to collective bargaining agreements, upcoming millage proposals, potential budget changes, etc.). However, Treasury may consider additional ongoing funding dedicated to your retirement system if those commitments have been formally enacted by the governing body and can be documented. ### MICHIGAN COUNTY ROAD COMMISSION SELF-INSURANCE POOL

September 1, 2020

Dear Members,

As you know, the Michigan County Road Commission Self-Insurance Pool (MCRCSIP) consistently seeks ways to reduce risk and add value to its members. As we watch our membership change via the county takeover actions, we are becoming more concerned about your legal and financial circumstances. We believe it is necessary to make several important changes to MCRCSIP's own menu of services. These changes will require amendments to the MCRCSIP bylaws, which we are asking you to consider today.

These changes are needed, in part, to help ensure all Michigan county road operations—regardless of whether they are organized as separate road commissions or as county departments—have access to the **very best general liability consulting and legal counsel**.

Why does this matter? When a road commission's structure is changed and they separate from MCRCSIP, they lose access to our extraordinary legal expertise. We, in turn, lose the ability to support their litigation as it moves through the court system. These outcomes put our members at risk for non-optimal judicial outcomes, which may later serve as undesirable precedents for their own future cases and lead to higher costs down the road.

To address these challenges, we now propose activating the Associate Membership category of membership for MCRCSIP. By permitting county departments to become associate members of MCRCSIP, we can allow them to continue participating in our organization's work on a limited—but very important—basis.

This change requires a revision to our shared bylaws:

- Allow County Road Departments to become Associate Members of MCRCSIP.
- There is provision to charge a fee for services.
- Associate Members do not have a vote and may not serve on the Board.
- Termination is simplified.

After discussing these changes with our legal counsel and many of you individually, we believe the time is right to make these changes. Enclosed for your review and consideration, therefore, is a new DRAFT set of bylaws for you to review prior to completing your Ballot.

### Why Change the By-Laws?

#### Because our specialized work deserves a comprehensive solution.

The effectiveness of the work we do depends on how other road agencies manage similar issues. The outcomes and experiences of one county may strongly influence the remaining 82—but today, our by-laws are preventing us from being involved as we should be.

#### We need to stay in sync.

Whether a county road operation is organized as a separate commission or as a county department, the work they do is the same. And all road agencies are safer if they all have the best general liability consulting and legal counsel available. Consistency helps to protect all of us.

But right now, some road commission organizational structures are being altered. This means the people working on those roads lose the benefits of being a MCRCSIP member. And what's more, MCRCSIP members lose the opportunity to help them prevail in court.

#### Failure to act puts us at risk.

When we lose the ability to support litigation across all 83 counties, we risk non-optimal judicial outcomes. These aren't "so what?" moments for MCRCSIP members—Poor court decisions can set undesirable precedents for our own future cases and lead to higher costs down the road.

#### The economics make sense.

The Board of Directors of MCRCSIP have listened to our insurance professionals, actuaries and consultants tell us that losing members can impact the stability of our Pool. Takeovers disrupt every component of the Pool's operations, from contribution allocations to lawsuit defense, and take staff time to manage. It makes much more sense to keep our members, charge them a fee based on cost of services provided and help them to adapt to their new situation with good, defensible processes that protect the Pool.

#### We need a new membership category.

By permitting county departments to become associate members of MCRCSIP, we can allow them to continue participating in our organization's work on a limited—but very important—basis.

#### The time for this change is right now.

Every day we wait puts all our members at risk. Let's act now to make MCRCSIP's by-laws strong enough to accommodate our members' changing needs.

# MICHIGAN COUNTY ROAD COMMISSION SELF-INSURANCE POOL BY-LAWS

#### **ARTICLE I**

#### **NAME**

The name of this organization shall be the Michigan County Road Commission Self-Insurance Pool (hereinafter referred to as the "Pool").

#### ARTICLE II

#### **PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES**

The Michigan Legislature, during its regular session in 1982, adopted Act 138 which became immediately effective April 27, 1982. Act 138 of 1982 amends the Intergovernmental Contracts Act of 1951, Act 35, PA 1951, as amended, thereby authorizing "contracts between municipal corporations to form group self-insurance pools, and to prescribe conditions to the performance of those contracts." Act 138 went on to define municipal corporations as including county road commissions.

In accordance with the provisions of Act 138, these By-laws govern a road commission self-insurance pool whose general objectives are to formulate, develop, and administer a self-insurance program for members of the pool, to establish the Michigan County Road Commission Self-Insurance Pool, to finance such a program, and to develop suitable financial and management plans. The Pool has been established by a Trust Agreement executed by the initial participating county road commissions and by the initial Board of Directors ("Pool Board"), as Trustees of the Trust, designated by the initial participating county road commissions.

#### **ARTICLE III**

#### **NATURE OF THE ORGANIZATION**

The Pool shall be comprised of county road commissions of the State of Michigan which are authorized and approved under Section 1 of Act 138, PA 1982, as amended (MCL 124.1; MSA 5.4081), to enter into an agreement to pool their loss exposures and which have executed the Pool Trust Agreement. Each participating county road commission shall adopt and execute such written agreements as may be required by law or by the Pool Board. The Pool is not to operate as an insurance company or an insurer under the laws of the State of Michigan, but rather is to be the contracting mechanism by which each Member receives, from the Pool, risk and financial management services and protections.

The Pool shall be established and operated by the Members through the Pool Board. The Pool shall not be a function, service, or agent of the County Road Association of Michigan.

#### **ARTICLE IV**

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

1. Members. A Member county road commission (herein referred to as "Member"), shall be a county road commission located in the State of Michigan, which has paid its annual contribution, as determined by the Pool Board, and has met other requirements as may be set by the Pool Board, including execution of the Intergovernmental Agreement and the Trust Agreement. The term "road commission" includes a municipal corporation, a division of a municipal corporation, a governmental agency, or an organization created by the execution of one or more Intergovernmental Agreements where the commissioners of a county road commission also act as the commissioners or other governing board or body of the municipal corporation, division of a municipal corporation, governmental agency, or an organization created by the execution of one or more Intergovernmental Agreements (such as a Park Board or Water & Sewer Authority). All new Members shall be approved by a two-thirds vote of the Pool Board.

For the purpose of voting at meetings, a representative from the Member shall be designated by its respective Board of County Road Commissioners to cast votes on behalf of the Member. An alternate delegate may also be designated by said Board of County Road Commissioners of the Member for the purpose of voting in the absence of the designated voting representative. Both the designated voting representative and the designated alternate delegate shall be either a road commissioner of said Member or a full-time employee of said Member.

- 2. Associate Members. A county that has assumed the powers, duties and functions of its road commission under MCL 46.11(s) or MCL 224.6(5) and any county road commissions located in Michigan who have that has not paid a contribution, as designated by the Pool Board, but and who express an interest in being associated with the Pool may apply to be an designated as Associate Members. Associate Members shall be approved by two-thirds vote of the Pool Board. The Pool Board may determine if fees will be charged to said Associate Members for services provided to the Associate Members by the Pool. Such fees may be reduced or waived in consideration of the provision of claims data and other information or services useful to the Pool. Associate Members shall not have voting rights, nor shall they be eligible to serve as voting Members of the Pool Board. Associate Members may withdraw from the Pool by giving at least sixty days written notice to the Pool Board. Associate Members may be terminated from membership by a two-thirds vote of the Pool Board.
- 3. <u>Meetings.</u> There shall be an annual meeting of the Members as soon as practicable after the close of the fiscal year. Additional meetings of the Members may be called by a vote of the majority of the Pool Board. The Pool Board shall establish the time and place for the annual meeting and any special meetings. All meetings of the Pool shall be held in Michigan.
- 4. <u>Conduct of Meetings.</u> The Chairperson of the Pool Board, or in his or her absence, the Vice Chairperson, shall conduct the annual meeting of the Members and any special meetings of the Members. In the absence of both the Chairperson and the Vice Chairperson, a temporary Chairperson for that meeting shall be elected by a majority vote of the Members present. All proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order.
- 5. <u>Notice of Meetings.</u> Members shall be notified not less than thirty days prior to the date of the annual or any special meeting. The notice shall include the date, time, place, and proposed topics for action or discussion.
- **6. Quorum.** A majority of the Membership shall constitute a quorum for any meeting of the Members.
- 7. <u>Minutes.</u> The Secretary of the Pool Board shall keep minutes of the annual and special meetings of the Members.

#### **ARTICLE V**

#### **BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

1. Election. The Board of Directors of the Pool (herein referred to as the "Pool Board") shall consist of nine members (herein referred to as "Directors") elected by the members at an annual meeting. The term of each director shall be three years, commencing upon the adjournment of the annual meeting at which they are elected. The individual Directors shall be either a road commissioner of a Member or a full-time employee of a Member. The Pool Board shall include at least two representatives from each of the three regions of the State of Michigan. Each Member may cast votes for Directors from the Region within which the Member is located and At-Large Directors. For purposes of representation on the Pool Board, the three regions of the State shall be known as the Southern Region, Northern Region and Upper Peninsula Region. The three regions are identified as follows and shall include the following counties:

Southern Region: Allegan, Barry, Bay, Berrien, Branch, Calhoun, Cass, Clinton, Eaton, Genesee, Gratiot, Hillsdale, Huron, Ingham, Ionia, Jackson, Kalamazoo, Kent, Lapeer, Lenawee, Livingston, Macomb, Monroe, Muskegon, Oakland, Ottawa, Saginaw, Sanilac, Shiawassee, St. Clair, St. Joseph, Tuscola, Van Buren, Washtenaw and Wayne.

Northern Region: Alcona, Alpena, Antrim, Arenac, Benzie,
Charlevoix, Cheboygan, Clare, Crawford, Emmet, Gladwin, Grand
Traverse, Iosco, Isabella, Kalkaska, Lake, Leelanau, Manistee, Mason,
Mecosta, Midland, Missaukee, Montcalm, Montmorency, Newaygo,
Oceana, Ogemaw, Osceola, Oscoda, Otsego, Presque Isle, Roscommon and Wexford.

<u>Upper Peninsula Region</u>: Alger, Baraga, Chippewa, Delta, Dickinson, Gogebic, Houghton, Iron, Keweenaw, Luce, Mackinac, Marquette, Menominee, Ontonagon and Schoolcraft.

For purposes of election of any Director by the Members, there shall be at least twice as many nominations as there are open positions. When it becomes necessary to elect a Director from one or more regions, those Director's positions shall be voted on separately and nominations shall be made up of persons representing Members from the appropriate region. The regional representation requirement may be waived if all members from a region annually agree to waive it.

- **2. Term.** The term of each Director shall be three years. The terms shall be staggered so that three Directors are elected at each annual meeting of the Members. To this end, at the first meeting of the Members, three Directors shall be elected to a one year term of office, three Directors shall be elected to a two year term of office, and three Directors shall be elected to a three year term of office.
- 3. Officers. Annually, at the first meeting following the annual meeting of the Members, the Pool Board shall elect a Chairperson and Vice Chairperson. The Pool Board shall also appoint a Secretary and Treasurer to the Pool Board, who need not be a Director.
- 4. Meetings. The Pool Board shall meet not less often than semiannually. The first meeting shall not be more than one week following the annual meeting of the Members, and shall be held in Michigan. Other meetings may be called by either the Chairperson or a majority of the Pool Board, and shall also be held in Michigan. All proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order.
- **5.** Minutes. Minutes of meetings of the Pool Board shall be kept by the Secretary or in the Secretary's absence any other person appointed by the Chairperson.
- **6. Quorum.** Five Directors shall constitute a quorum for any meeting of the Pool Board. No action shall be taken except on a concurring vote of a majority of those in attendance or on such vote as may otherwise be required by the Intergovernmental Agreement, Trust or these By-Laws.



- **7.** <u>Compensation.</u> The Directors shall serve without compensation. However, upon the request of a Director, the Pool Board shall reimburse a Director for actual, necessary, and reasonable expenses incurred either for the purpose of attending Pool Board meetings or in the conduct of other Pool business.
- **8.** Resignation and Removal. Any Director who fails to meet the eligibility requirements during that person's term of office shall be considered to have automatically resigned. A Director may be removed from office by a vote of two-thirds of the Members present at an annual meeting of the Members. In the event of such resignation or removal which occurs at any annual meeting of the Members, the Members shall, acting in accordance with all requirements of these Bylaws for the election of a Director, immediately elect a replacement Director. Any newly elected Director filling an unexpired term shall serve only the remainder of the term for the vacated position. Should the vacancy involve an officer of the Pool Board, the Pool Board shall elect a new officer.
- 9. <u>Vacancies.</u> Should a vacancy occur on the Pool Board, other than at an annual meeting of the Members, the Chairperson with approval of the Pool Board shall appoint a temporary replacement who shall serve until the next annual meeting of the Members. The replacement must meet the requirements of eligibility, including the required regional representation.

#### **ARTICLE VI**

#### **POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE BOARD**

The Pool Board in addition to other powers and duties herein conferred and imposed or authorized by law, shall have the following powers and duties:

- 1. The Pool Board shall be authorized to contract with any qualified individual or organization to perform any of the functions necessary for the carrying out of a self-insured Pool arrangement, including the provision of excess loss insurance, "stop loss," insurance, umbrella insurance, reinsurance, the investigation of claims, the handling of claims, the settlement of claims, safety engineering services, administrative services, and any and all other services that the Pool Board shall deem appropriate.
- 2. The Pool Board shall prepare an Intergovernmental Agreement and shall require that each member execute said Intergovernmental Agreement as a condition of membership.
- 3. The Pool Board shall make provision for proper accounting and reporting procedures for each of the Members so that they shall be apprised at all times of the nature of the claims arising within their jurisdiction, the manner in which these claims are being handled, and the impact of the same upon the Pool.
- 4. The Pool Board shall maintain such accounts, funds, and records as may be required by good accounting practice. The Pool Board shall provide for an annual certified audit of the books of the Pool by an independent Certified Public Accountant. A copy of the audit report shall be supplied to each of the Members and the Michigan Department of Insurance and Financial Services as required by law.



- 5. As required by law, the Pool Board shall provide an annual actuarial certification by an independent actuary that the reserves set aside pursuant to Act 138 of the Michigan Public Acts of 1982, as amended are adequate for the payment of claims. A copy of the actuarial certification shall be provided to the Department of Insurance and Financial Services as required by law.
- 6. The Pool Board shall arrange for the investing of monies of the Pool to keep the same invested as required by law. The Pool Board shall provide for the banking of the monies of the Pool and the proper security of any and all investments.
- 7. The Pool Board shall adopt a balanced annual budget and shall require that the budget be adhered to. The Pool Board may amend the budget at any time.
  - **8.** The Pool Board shall adopt a risk management and loss control plan.
- 9. The Pool Board shall adopt and equally enforce rules and procedures for the handling, investigation, defense, administration, and settlement of claims. Said rules and procedures shall specify each Member's responsibilities and involvement in claims matters. These rules and procedures, including settlement authority, shall be incorporated in the Intergovernmental Agreement and executed by each Member.
- **10.** The Pool Board shall perform annual reviews consisting of the following, and shall present the results of these reviews to the Membership at the annual meeting:
  - **A.** Audit and summary financial review;
  - B. Risk Management and loss prevention review; and
  - **C.** Claims review.
  - **D.** Annual budget.

- 11. The Chairperson of the Pool Board may appoint an Executive Committee or Designee of the Pool Board to handle the affairs of the Pool Board in-between the regular meetings or any of the special Pool Board meetings, with such functions as may be designated to the Executive Committee or designee by the Pool Board in a resolution properly adopted. Other special committees or designees may also be appointed by the Chairperson, as needed, with powers spelled out in a resolution properly adopted by the Pool Board.
- 12. The Pool Board shall require the securing of a fidelity bond on each and all of the employees of the Pool Board or upon other persons charged with the duty of handling any of the monies or investments of the Pool. The Pool shall pay the premium for such a bond.
- 13. The Pool Board may provide for a suitable seal with the following letters upon its face: "Michigan County Road Commission Self-Insurance Pool." The seal shall be used for the authentication of legal documents, contracts, and other instruments indicating the official action of the Pool Board.
- 14. The Pool Board shall have the general power to make and enter into all contracts, leases, and agreements necessary or convenient to carry out any of the powers granted under the Trust Agreement, these By-laws or any other laws. All such contracts, leases, and agreements, or other legal documents herein authorized shall be approved by resolution of the Pool Board and shall be executed by those individuals designated in such resolution. In the absence of such a designation, all approved contracts shall be executed by the Chairperson or Vice Chairperson.
- 15. The Pool Board shall carry out all the duties necessary for the proper operation and administration of the Pool on behalf of the Members and to that end shall have all of the power necessary and desirable for the effective administration of the affairs of the Pool.



#### **ARTICLE VII**

#### **ADMINISTRATION**

There shall be an Administrator of the Pool (herein referred to as the "Administrator") to administer the financial and administrative affairs of the Pool. The Administrator shall be an employee of the Pool and shall be appointed by, and serve at the pleasure of the Pool Board. The Administrator shall have the power and authority to implement policy matters set forth by the Pool Board as they relate to the ongoing operation and supervision of the Pool and the provisions of the Trust Agreement establishing the Pool, the By-laws, the Intergovernmental Agreement, applicable Federal and/or State statutes, and other applicable governmental rules and regulations.

The Pool Board shall establish, maintain, and provide adequate funding for an office of the Pool, also administered by the Administrator. The address of such office shall be made known to the Members and other road commissions interested in participating in the Pool, and to the appropriate governmental agencies and departments of the State of Michigan. The Administrator may hire staff, purchase equipment and supplies, and incur expenses within the limits set in the annual budget.

#### **ARTICLE VIII**

#### **DETERMINATION OF COVERAGE TO BE PROVIDED**

The Pool Board shall determine the terms, conditions, and length of the Intergovernmental Agreement, which it shall develop and prepare to be signed by each of the Members as they join the Pool. The Pool Board shall determine the amount of insurance, which shall be purchased by the Pool. The Pool Board shall also make any other arrangements or contracts deemed necessary to meet requirements of law, or which it determines to be necessary for the operation of the Pool. The amount and type of insurance coverages to be provided to members shall be identified in the Intergovernmental Agreement to be signed by each Member.

#### **ARTICLE IX**

#### **INDEMNIFICATION OF OFFICERS, TRUSTEES, AND EMPLOYEES**

The Pool shall indemnify each person now or hereafter a Director, trustee, officer, employee or agent of the Pool, and the heirs, executors, administrators, or other legal representatives of such Director, trustee, officer, employee, or agent, from and against reasonable expenses and losses incurred or suffered by them in connection with any claim, action, suit, or proceeding, civil or criminal, actual or threatened, in which he or she may be involved by reasons of his or her being or having been such Director, trustee, officer, employee, or agent, or by reason of his or her alleged acts or omissions as such a Director, trustee, officer, employee, or agent, regardless of whether he or she is such a Director, trustee, officer, employee, or agent at the time of incurring such expenses and losses, except with respect to any matter as to which he or she shall have been adjudicated in any proceeding to have been guilty of gross negligence or shall have been adjudicated in any proceeding not to have acted in good faith in the reasonable belief that his or her action was in the best interest of the Pool; provided, however, that the Pool, by vote of the Pool Board, may compromise and settle any such claim, action, suit, or proceeding and pay such expenses and losses, if such settlement and payment appear to be in the best interest of the Pool. Such indemnification may include payment by the Pool of expenses incurred in defending a civil or criminal action or proceeding in advance of the final disposition of such action or proceeding, upon receipt of an agreement executed by the person to be indemnified agreeing to repay such payment if he or she shall be adjudicated to be not entitled to indemnification.

#### **ARTICLE X**

#### <u>DETERMINATION OF CONTRIBUTIONS BY MEMBERS</u> <u>OR REFUNDS TO MEMBERS</u>

The Pool Board shall determine the amount of contribution to be paid annually by each Member. Such contribution shall be calculated based on past experience, projected future losses, excess and stop loss insurance costs, reinsurance costs, umbrella insurance costs, administrative costs, loss prevention costs, and any other projected expenses to be incurred in the operation and administration of the Pool. Should deficiencies or surpluses occur within the funding of the Pool, the Pool Board shall determine the method of addressing these deficiencies or surpluses through the annual contribution mechanism. The Pool Board may employ actuarial services or other professional assistance in determining the appropriate contribution. The contributions by the individual members shall be clearly spelled out in an annual contribution notice.

#### **ARTICLE XI**

#### **FISCAL YEAR**

The fiscal year of the Pool shall be from April 1 through March 31.

#### **ARTICLE XII**

#### WITHDRAWAL OR TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP

Any Member may withdraw from the Pool by giving at least sixty days written notice to the Pool Board of its desire to so withdraw. The Pool Board shall develop procedures for addressing accumulated equity, if any, or accumulated funding deficiency. The Pool Board shall determine the short rate cancellation penalty for terminating prior to the annual renewal date. A Member may be terminated from membership by a two-thirds vote of the Members present at an annual or special meeting of the Members. Reasons for termination of Members may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1. Failure to follow the rules designated by the Pool Board in claims handling or other matters as set forth by the Pool Board.
- **2.** A loss of eligibility.
- 3. Willful and continuous refusal to follow the recommendations of the Pool Board or Administrator regarding loss prevention and other Risk Management programs.
- 4. Acting in a manner which is counter to the interests of the Pool and its Members.

#### **ARTICLE XIII**

#### **AMENDMENTS**

The By-laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the Pool Board with the additional approval of a two-thirds vote of the Members casting ballots thereon, provided that said amendment shall comply to applicable statutes regarding the establishment and operation of a self-insurance pool. Upon receipt of a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Pool Board, a copy of the proposed amendment shall be sent to all Members. The concurrence of the Members, if not provided at a duly called special or annual meeting of the Pool, may be delivered to the Pool office via the United States Postal Service or overnight mail not later than forty (40) days from the date that the proposed amendment is furnished to the Members by the Pool Board.

Alternatively, any Member may propose an amendment to the By-laws by submitting a copy of the proposed amendment in writing to the Pool Board. The Pool Board shall consider the proposed amendment at the first regular or special meeting of the Pool Board following the receipt of the proposed amendment. If the proposed amendment receives a two-thirds (2/3) affirmative vote of the Pool Board, a copy of the proposed amendment to the By-laws shall be provided to all Members for consideration and the vote of the Members as set forth above. A copy of any such approved amendment shall be sent to all Members.

### ARTICLE I BOARD OF COUNTY ROAD COMMISSIONERS

- Governing Body. Pursuant to the County Road Law, Act 283 of 1909, as amended (MCL 220.1 et seq.), the governing body of the Washtenaw County Road Commission (the "Road Commission") is the Board of County Road Commissioners of Washtenaw County (the "Board").
- 2. **Powers and Authority.** The Board shall manage the business and affairs of the Road Commission and shall have all the powers and authority conferred by law.
- 3. Transaction of Business. All business of the Board shall be transacted at a meeting of the Board, noticed and convened in accordance with the Michigan Open Meetings Act and these Bylaws, at which a quorum is present. Individual Road Commissioners shall have no power to act for the Board in any manner except as specifically authorized by official action of the Board, as recorded in its minutes.
- 4. **Quorum and Action.** A majority of the Members of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The act of a majority of the Members of the Board shall be the act of the Board. A roll call vote or resolution shall be taken in all of the following circumstances: (a) appropriating money; (b) a matter involving a financial liability on the part of the Road Commission; or (c) a matter being voted on by a Board Member participating remotely pursuant to Article III, Section 9. If a quorum is not present (in person or per Article III, Section 9) for any meeting, a majority of those present may adjourn the meeting to a future time.
- 5. Compensation. Members of the Board shall be compensated for services rendered to the Washtenaw County Road Commission as determined by the Board of County Commissioners of Washtenaw County. At the discretion of the Board, Members may be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the discharge of their official duties.
- 6. Conflict of Interest. No Member of the Board shall have an interest, directly or indirectly, in any contract with the Road Commission which may cause a substantial conflict of interest or the appearance of impropriety. The conduct of a Member of the Board shall conform to the Standards of Conduct For Public Officers and Employees, Act 196 of 1973, as amended (MCL 15.341 et seq.). To ensure the faithful performance of their official duties and avoid conflict of interest, Members of the Board shall conform to the Incompatible Public Offices Act, Act 566 of 1978, as amended (MCL 15.181 et seq.).

### ARTICLE II OFFICERS OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY ROAD COMMISSIONERS

- 1. **Officers.** The officers of the Board include a Chair and a Vice Chair. The Chair and Vice Chairs shall be Members of the Board. Officers shall serve a term of two (2) consecutive years
- 2. Chair. The Chair shall be the head of the Board and shall have the usual powers of that office. The Chair shall preside at all meetings of the Board at which he/she is physically present at the site of the meeting. If both the Chair and the Vice Chair are not physically present at the site of the meeting, the Chair shall appoint a Member to preside at the meeting. The Chair shall appoint all committees, unless the committee members are designated or their appointment otherwise provided for in the motion or resolution establishing the committee, be an ex-officio member of all committees, and perform such other duties as these Bylaws provide or the Board may prescribe.
- 3. **Vice Chair.** The Vice Chair shall preside at meetings of the Board in the absence of the physical on-site presence of the Chair and shall perform such other duties as the Board of Road Commissioners may prescribe.
- 4. **Members.** The Members shall perform such other duties as the Board may prescribe. Any new Member of the Board appointed shall take the oath of office as their first order of business.

### ARTICLE III MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY ROAD COMMISSIONERS

1. Organizational Meeting. At a regular meeting of the Board held in December of each year, the Chair shall call the meeting to order then shall call the roll of all appointed Road Commissioners. If the Chair is then completing his or her two (2) year term, and a quorum is found to be present, the Board shall proceed to elect one of the Road Commissioners, appointed and serving, as Chair to serve for the following two (2) years, with the term beginning January 1<sup>st</sup> of the coming year and ending the December 31<sup>st</sup> two (2) years thereafter (the "Following Term"). The Commissioner receiving majority vote of the Members, appointed and serving, shall be the Chair of the Board for the Following Term. The Vice Chair shall be nominated and elected by the Board at the same meeting, in the same manner as and following, the Chair of the Board. Except as required by law, the Officers of the Board shall have only the authority, duties and responsibilities delegated by the Board, in accordance with the Bylaws of the Board.

- 2. Regular Meetings. The Board shall meet on a regular basis at times determined by the Board. Regular meetings may be cancelled in advance by consent of the Board. Regular meetings will ordinarily be held on the first and third Tuesdays at 1:00 p.m. of each calendar month in the Board meeting room at the Road Commission, 555 N. Zeeb Road, Ann Arbor, Michigan, 48103, but may be held at such other times and places as the Board may determine. Notices of the regular meetings shall comply with the requirements of the Michigan Open Meetings Act, as amended, and these Bylaws.
- 3. **Notice of Regular Meetings.** Notice of the dates, times and places of all scheduled regular meetings of the Board during the upcoming calendar year shall be posted within ten (10) days after the first meeting of the Board in each calendar year. This notice shall indicate that the meetings are to be of the Board of County Road Commissioners of the County of Washtenaw, and shall state the address, telephone number and website of the Road Commission. The notice shall be posted in a conspicuous location in the lobby of the Road Commission administrative office located at 555 N. Zeeb Road, Ann Arbor, Michigan 48103, and on the Road Commission website.
- 4. Change in Regular Meetings. If there is a change in the schedule of regular meetings of the Board, there will be posted, within three (3) days after the meeting at which the change is made, a public notice stating the new dates, times and places of its regular meetings. For a rescheduled regular meeting, a public notice stating the date, time and place of the meeting shall be posted at least 18 hours before the meeting in a prominent and conspicuous place at both the lobby of the Road Commission administrative office located at 555 N. Zeeb Road, Ann Arbor, Michigan 48103, and on the Road Commission website, on either the homepage or on a separate webpage dedicated to public notices for non-regularly scheduled public meetings and accessible via a prominent and conspicuous link on the website's homepage that clearly describes its purpose for public notification of those non-regularly scheduled public meetings (the "18-Hour Rule"). A meeting of the Board that is recessed for more than 36 hours shall be reconvened only after public notice that is equivalent to that required under subsection 3 has been posted.
- 5. **Special Meetings.** If the Board determines that consideration of a matter should not wait until the next regular meeting of the Board, then the Board may schedule and convene a special meeting of the Board, provided the public notice of the subject of the item(s) to be considered, date, time and place of the special meeting shall be made pursuant to the 18-Hour Rule.
- 6. Emergency Session. Nothing in this Article shall bar the Board from meeting in emergency session in the event of a severe and imminent threat to the health, safety or welfare of the public, when the two-thirds of the Board decides that delay would be detrimental to efforts to lessen or respond to the threat. Notice of the emergency session shall be given pursuant to the 18-Hour Rule, or paper copies of the public notice for the emergency session shall be made available to the public at the emergency session. The notice shall include an explanation of the reasons that the Board cannot comply with the 18-hour Rule. The explanation shall be specific to the circumstances that necessitated the

emergency session, and the use of generalized explanations such as "an imminent threat to the health of the public" or "a danger to public welfare and safety" does not meet the explanation requirements of this subsection. Within 48 hours after an emergency session conducted without notice pursuant to the 18-Hour Rule, the Board shall send official correspondence to the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Washtenaw, informing the commission that an emergency session with less than 18 hours' public notice has taken place.

- 7. **Working Sessions**. The purpose of a Working Session shall be to permit in-depth, informal discussion of Commissioner concerns, Board goals, significant programmatic and financial matters, and conceptual and informational presentations by the Managing Director.
- 8. **Meeting Agendas**. The agenda for regular Board meetings shall be prepared under the direction of the Managing Director, with the concurrence of the Chair, and emailed, mailed or personally delivered to the Road Commissioners at least 72 hours before the meeting. At a regular meeting, the Board may consider and act on any matter which may come before it, whether or not the matter is included on the prepared agenda.
- 9. Participation By Members in Meeting by Videoconference or Similar Equipment. A Member of the Board may participate in any meeting of the Board by videoconference or similar communications equipment through which all persons participating in the meeting can hear and see each other, provided that a quorum of Members is physically present at the site of the meeting, and either the Chair, Vice Chair or a Member appointed by the Chair to preside at the meeting, is physically present at the site of the meeting to conduct the meeting. Participation in a meeting pursuant to this section constitutes being "present" in person at the meeting for all purposes.
- 10. Open Meetings. All meetings of the Board shall be conducted in accordance with the Michigan Open Meetings Act (MCL 15.261 et seq.), as amended. All sessions or meetings of the Board shall be open to the public and shall be held in a place available to the general public. All decisions and deliberations of the Board constituting a quorum of its Members shall take place at a meeting open to the public, except as those permitted to be closed under Michigan law. All persons shall be permitted to attend any open meeting of the Board.
- 11. **Closed Meetings.** The Board may meet in closed session in accordance with Michigan law for the following purposes: personnel evaluation, collective bargaining, real property transaction, litigation, legal advice and counsel, and to consider material exempt from discussion or disclosure by state or federal statute.

- 12. **Order of Business of Regular Meetings.** The business of all regular meetings of the Board shall be transacted as far as practicable, in the following order.
  - a. Call to Order/Pledge of Allegiance
  - b. Approval of Agenda
  - c. Acceptance of Minutes
  - d. Public Comment
  - e. Commissioner and Staff Follow-Up to Public Comment
  - f. New Business
  - g. Unfinished Business
  - h. Reports
  - i. Adjournment
- 13. Addressing the Meeting. In order to provide a free flow of information between the public and the Board, and at the same time assure the integrity of agenda and orderly scheduled meetings, the provisions of these Bylaws will govern citizen participation during the public meetings. Any person in attendance at a meeting of the Board (either physically or by telecommunications) shall be permitted to address the meeting subject to the following rules.
- 14. Addressing the Meeting: Members of the Community. Members of the community who wish to address the Board may do so: (1) in written communication; and/or (2) by appearing (either physically or by telecommunications) at a regular meeting, and, at a time designated in the agenda, speaking directly to the Board.
  - a. **Written Communication.** Letters and other forms of written communication should be addressed to the Board Secretary in care of the Washtenaw County Road Commission. Letters and other forms of written communication will be presented to the Board by the Board Secretary when the Board next meets.
  - b. Appearance in Person or By Telecommunications. Members of the community who wish to speak directly to the Board at a regular meeting will be afforded the opportunity to do so at a designated point in the regular agenda. A member of the community addressing the Board will be requested to identify him/herself by name and to indicate the capacity in which he/she is speaking, i.e., whether as a private interested citizen or as the representative of an interest group or other organization. The Chair of the Board retains the right to establish time limits to govern the length of an individual presentation, and to proscribe disorderly conduct

pursuant to Article III, Section 20 of these Bylaws. Further, in those instances where similar presentations of fact or opinion are made by many citizens, the Chair retains the right to move the meeting forward to the next item of business when the Chair is satisfied that individual presentations are repetitious or cumulative. When members of the community wish to address the Board via telecommunications, the Chair shall have the right to limit all such telecommunications to sound only, without video appearance.

- 15. Addressing the Meeting: Members of the Road Commission Staff. Presentations by members of the Road Commission staff will be governed by the same procedure established above for members of the community, except that staff making reports requested by the Managing Director or the Board may be given the opportunity to speak as part of the Managing Director's report.
- 16. Written Material. Any person may submit written material, regardless of length, to the Board for consideration, whether or not in connection with an address by the person to the Board. All such written material shall be delivered to the Board Secretary personally, email or by mail, at the Washtenaw County Road Commission, 555 N. Zeeb Road, Ann Arbor, Michigan 48103.
- 17. **Exclusion from Meetings.** No person shall be excluded from a meeting of the Board except for a breach of the peace actually committed at the meeting.
- 18. **Rules of Procedure.** The business of each regular meeting shall be conducted under Robert's Rules of Order as modified by the Bylaws of the Board.
- 19. **Voting.** Every Member who shall be present, including the Chair, when a motion is last stated by the Chair, and no other, shall vote for or against the motion unless the Member has a conflict of interest in which case the Member shall not vote.
  - a. **Roll Call Vote.** Roll call vote shall be taken when called for by any Member of the Board, and on board actions to adopt ordinances, resolutions, the appointment or election of officers, and any action: (a) appropriating money; or (b) involving a financial liability on the part of the Road Commission; or (c) a matter being voted on by a Board Member participating remotely pursuant to Article III, Section 9.
  - b. **Votes Required.** Procedural and other questions arising at a meeting of the Road Commissioners, except for those decisions required by statute or by these Bylaws to have a higher majority, shall be decided by a majority of the Members present.
- 20. Disorderly Conduct. The Chair may call to order any person who is being disorderly by speaking longer than the allotted time or otherwise disrupting the meeting. Such person shall therefore be seated until the Chair shall have determined whether the person is in order. If a person shall be called out of order, he or she shall not be permitted to speak further at the same meeting except upon special leave by the board. No person shall be

removed from a public meeting except for an actual breach of the peace committed at the meeting.

- 21. **Suspension.** No rule of the Board shall be suspended, amended or rescinded, without the concurrence of a majority of the Members appointed and serving.
- 22. Chair's Right to Participate in Debate. The Chair may participate in debate in the same manner as any other Member without relinquishing the Chair, on any matter before the Board, unless a majority of the Members present request that he/she relinquish the Chair to participate in debate on a particular matter.
- 23. **Minutes.** The Board shall cause to be prepared and kept a full and complete written record of every meeting of the Board, including the date, time, place, Members present and the manner in which present (in person or teleconference), Members absent, any decisions made at an open meeting, and the purpose or purposes for which a closed session is held. The minutes shall include all roll call votes taken at the meeting. All motions and resolutions shall be fully recorded, whether they are approved or not, and the names of those who make the motions, those who seconded the motions and the votes of the Road Commissioners on each such motion shall be recorded. If the Board votes unanimously, it is sufficient to record the fact; provided that every vote or resolution appropriating money or involving a pecuniary liability on the part of the Road Commission shall be taken by calling the ayes and nays, and the names of those voting respectively for and against shall be recorded by the Board Secretary.
- 24. Preparation and Mailing of Minutes. Minutes of the meetings shall be prepared by the Board Secretary under the direction of the Managing Director and emailed, mailed or personally delivered to the Members of the Board at least 72 hours before the next regular meeting.
- 25. Availability of Minutes to the Public. Minutes of meetings (except closed sessions) shall be public records open to public inspection and shall be available at the Road Commission administrative office and posted to the Road Commission website. Proposed minutes shall be available for inspection not later than eight (8) business days after the meeting to which the minutes refer, and approved minutes shall be available for public inspection not later than five (5) business days after the minutes are approved by the Board.
- 26. **Responsibility of the Secretary to the Board.** The secretary to the Board shall be responsible for posting all notices required for all meetings, preparing agenda, and keeping minutes as provided in these bylaws.

### ARTICLE IV FISCAL AFFAIRS

- 1. **Fiscal Year.** The fiscal year of the Road Commission shall be from January 1 to December 31, inclusive.
- 2. **Final Budget.** The Board shall adopt a final budget for the ensuing fiscal year on or before its first regular meeting in December of each year.
- 3. **Budgetary Control.** The administration shall operate within approved budget allotments. No budget allotment shall be deemed a mandate to spend. The Managing Director shall approve all expenditures beyond line item allotments within budgetary limitations. Expenditures in excess of approved budgetary limitations must be approved by the Board.
- 4. **Accounting Procedures and Reports.** The administration shall be charged with the responsibility of following accepted and statutory accounting procedures per Act 51 of 1951, as amended. The administration shall provide the Board with such interim fiscal reports as the Board, from time to time, may require.
- 5. Certified Public Accountants. At its organizational meeting or otherwise by resolution, the Board shall appoint a firm of certified public accountants to serve at the pleasure of the Board. All accounts of the Road Commission shall be audited once each year and at such times as the Board may determine. A copy of the audit shall be filed as required by statute, and another copy shall be made available at the Road Commission administrative office for public examination.

### ARTICLE V ADMINISTRATION

- Managing Director. The chief executive officer of the Road Commission shall be designated Managing Director. The Managing Director of the Road Commission shall administer the affairs of the Road Commission. His or her administration shall conform to the adopted policies of the Board.
- 2. **Legal Counsel.** At its organizational meeting or otherwise by resolution, the Board shall appoint outside legal counsel to serve at the pleasure of the Board.
- 3. Policies. The Board shall adopt written policies governing the operation of the Road Commission and the employment of all personnel. Such policies shall be recommended by the Managing Director and shall include appropriate classification of personnel, terms of employment and compensation schedules. The Managing Director shall keep the Board fully advised as the need or desirability of any changes in these policies.




#### ARTICLE VI REPEAL OR AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS






