## Snow Plowing

### • Priorities

WCRC performs winter maintenance activities in accordance with its Winter Maintenance Policy approved by the Washtenaw County Board of County

Road Commissioners. This policy includes a priority system for clearing snow and ice from roads that is based on traffic volumes, location and road classification. Listed to the right are the route descriptions. Click here for more information on winter

#### Primary Routes

The most highly traveled roads in the county. When it's snowing, WCRC crews focus all efforts to keep these clear for emergency vehicles and all travelers.

Examples: I-94, US-23, M-52, US-12, M-14, & county paved roads.

#### Secondary Routes

Local roads like subdivision or gravel roads. These will be cleared once the primary routes are cleared. If it starts to snow again, WCRC crews will leave these roads to go back to primary routes.

## Materials to Fight Slick Roads



Grit/Sand



Salt



Mix

Used on gravel roads and at intersections to help provide traction.

Mixed with blue anti-caking additive. Most effective when road temps are above 17 degrees.

Grit and salt mixed. Used when temps are below 17 degrees, grit provides traction until salt can start working.



Please move vehicles, garbage cans, etc. out of the roadway to give our drivers plenty of room to do their job!

## Snow Plowing Obstructions

WCRC is unable to properly perform winter maintenance when there are obstructions in the road. Obstructions often include things like parked vehicles and trash cans. Please be sure to remove any obstructions from the road during winter storms to ensure that your road is not skipped! ## Equipment Used to Treat Icy Roads



### Salt Truck


Mixed with blue anti-caking additive, the salt is most effective at melting snow when road temps are above 17 degrees.

### Grader

Graders are used on unpaved roads because regular snow plows can scrape away gravel. Graders allow us to protect the road surface.

### V-Plow

It's not very often that we have to break out the v-plows! V-plows come in handy with snow drifts.



Each year, the WCRC and the 20 township boards partner to provide local road improvements. In 2024, the WCRC Board increased its investment in local infrastructure to \$2 million, expanded its criteria of culvert maintenance replacements, and will continue to perform dust control as normal maintenance. While road funding is limited, both parties work hard to spend this precious funding efficiently and effectively.
